Our courses encourage young people and children to realise their ideas and broaden their expertise, exploring different materials, techniques and opportunities in industry standard studios and workshops.





Join storyteller Matthew Bellwood as he takes you on an adventure which leads you up The Film House's Clock Tower, and takes you back in time to meet Louis le Prince – the man who made the first ever film (in Leeds in 1888).

As you climb the steps you will learn about the amazing history of the clock as well as seeing the giant bell, the clock mechanism and clock itself, whilst taking in a view of Leeds like no other.

At the end of the tour you will get to take away a special souvenir of your visit and hopefully be inspired to make some films of your own!
